

Selectmen's meeting minutes for 10/17/2023

In attendance: Willie Ingraham, Joshua Larrabee, Ivy Larrabee, Kathy Martin, Charles Littlefield, and his Wife.

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm by Willie Ingraham

Previous meeting minutes were reviewed. Voted all in favored for approval.

The payroll warrant was reviewed and signed; the second warrant was not signed until the next day as there was a duplicate payment that needed to be voided.

Charles Littlefield and his wife were in attendance to discuss property lines. He is looking to possibly sell a piece of land; however, the lines need to be walked, and defined with the bordering property. He presented a deed. The Selectmen agreed to walk the property together with Charles and come up with an agreement for all. The bordering property appears to be owned by the Town of Knox.

Kathy Martin was in attendance to discuss her driveway culvert. She mentioned this was washed out for the third time this year and is now undermining the pavement. It was discussed that the culvert in her driveway possibly had to be increased in size to avoid this happening again. The Selectmen said they would go to the property to review the damage and make a plan to fix it.

The Selectmen discussed our current trash situation. Sullivans holds the current bid for curbside garbage removal. With the lack of drivers available for Sullivans, they are unable to continue curbside as of the first of the year. Josh reached out to the Freedom Town Office to get a quote from them to get us through to the town meeting. He is trying to find a service for the current bid price. They came back at \$1,100 a week; we are currently paying Sullivans \$746.51 a week. Josh is reaching out to other companies for bids as well. Bolsters, Pinkerton, and Freedom are all on the list to be contacted for quotes.

Ivy presented the Selectmen with employee health insurance options. Selectmen discussed different options for employee and town contribution. Tabled for now to review and discuss next meeting.

Willie mentioned the Morse Road washout. It appears there was an extra 5' culvert added to the York driveway, causing the water to not hit the placed culvert correctly and washing out the side of the road. The Selectmen discussed having to remove the culvert addition and adding material to the sides of the road to repair washout.
